1 APOLOGIES

RECOMMENDED on the motion of Greg Minehan and Tony Leadbitter that apologies be received from Joe Rizzo and Jason Hinson.

2 CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES

RECOMMENDED on the motion of Greg Minehan and Tony Leadbitter that the minutes of the previous meeting held on 12 December 2023, having first been circulated amongst all members. be confirmed.

3 BUSINESS ARISING

3.1 Kooyoo Street Speed Zone Review

Mr Minehan stated that the minimum length of road for a 30 km/h speed zone to be considered is 200 metres. As the Kooyoo Street Stage 2 road in question is only 60 metres, it is deemed ineligible and the default 50 km/h will remain. In light of this, the Committee agreed to withdraw the request and take the report off the Action Report.

CL03 TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT - GRIFFITH BIGGEST LAP MOTOR VEHICLE EVENT

RECOMMENDED on the motion of Greg Minehan and Tony Leadbitter that the Traffic Committee:

- (a) Support the implementation of the Traffic Control Plan associated with the 2024 Biggest Lap event; and
- (b) Note the Traffic Management Plan as submitted.

Michael Rowley entered the meeting, the time being 10:50 am.

6 OUTSTANDING ACTION REPORT

The Committee discussed the Outstanding Action Report.

6.1 Intersection Treatment – Noorilla Street and Boonah Street

Mr Balind discussed a proposed design, which includes the potential for a roundabout to form part of an intersection treatment, with some drainage issues still to be addressed. The design will be used to source funding for the intersection upgrade. A formal report will be brought to the Committee for endorsement.

6.2 Speed Zone Reviews

Mr Minehan noted media on the new Rifle Range Road speed zone will need to be rereleased and is still awaiting installation. He will inspect Nelson Drive later today, which is a new request received by Director Infrastructure & Operations Phil King. Slopes Road will be reported back to the next meeting.

CL01 TRAFFIC COMMITTEE APPROVAL FOR COMMUNITY EVENTS

The Committee discussed the proposal by General Manager Brett Stonestreet (attached) to approve annual community events with respect to traffic related matters for 2024, 2025 and 2026 as previously approved and to amend the Events Policy and Decision Tool to reduce the minimum time period for lodgement of documentation to Council from 4 months to 2 months.

Mr Minehan stated that TfNSW are opposing the proposal as the authority for state roads which are impacted by most of the events in question. Mr Leadbitter also noted the police's opposition to the request for three years of pre-approval due to annual events being reviewed by police on a case-by-case basis. Mr Rowley commented that he was opposing the reduction in minimum time for lodgement but was in favour of providing a detailed checklist for traffic and other requirements to event organisers to assist with the application process.

The Committee agreed that the onus was on event organisers to make sure their application was submitted in a timely manner, especially for annual events where dates are generally at the same time each year.

SMT Comment: The Traffic Committee did not make any recommendation with respect to this item. Notwithstanding this the minutes of the Traffic Committee above include comment to the effect of "opposing the proposal to implement preapproved events". Further the narrative also "opposes the reduction in minimum time required to submit applications for events from 4 months to 2 months".

Councillors have the following options:

OPTION 1

Council amend its policy to reduce the minimum time required by event organisers to notify Council from 4 months to 2 months.

Should this option be adopted by Council, staff will write to all applicants as submitted including a copy of the minutes of this Council meeting together with the copy of the report to the Traffic Committee for their information. Further, all applications for community events will be referred to the Traffic Committee for decision provided a fully compliant application is received at least 2 months prior to the event.

OPTION 2

Preapproved events will not be considered by Council as per these minutes. Council will continue to require applicants to submit all documentation with a minimum of 4 months prior to the event.

Should this option be adopted by Council, staff will write to all applicants as submitted including a copy of the minutes of this Council meeting together with the copy of the report to the Traffic Committee for their information. Further, all applications for community events will be referred to the Traffic Committee for decision provided a fully compliant application is received at least 2 months prior to the event.

CL02 TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT – VINTAGE FESTIVAL 30 MARCH 2024

Mr Balind presented the report, which listed traffic management similar to previous years, noting that the Certificate of Currency will expire at 4pm on the day of the event.

RECOMMENDED on the motion of Greg Minehan and Tony Leadbitter that the Traffic Committee approve the Traffic Management Plan and Traffic Control Plan for the 30 March 2024 Vintage Festival in principle, subject to the condition that the event organiser submit an updated Certificate of Currency 4 weeks prior to the event.

7 GENERAL BUSINESS

7.1 Hanwood School Crossing

Mr Minehan stated that the school crossing supervisor has commenced at Hanwood School as of last week, which was a great result for road safety in the area. Mr Balind, on behalf of the Committee, thanked Mr Minehan for his work on the project over the years.

7.2 Condition of Old Willbriggie Road

Mr Rowley raised the issue of potholes on Old Willbriggie Road between Murphy Road and Jack McWilliam Road causing dangerous conditions for drivers. On the same road, overgrown grass on the channel bank was making it difficult to see the next intersection and was completely blocking the 'Reduce Speed' sign when approaching. Mr Balind will assess. Roadside slashing will be referred to Council's works department while any channel vegetation issues will be referred to Murrumbidgee Irrigation.

The next meeting of the Traffic Committee is to be held on Tuesday, 12 March 2024 at 10:30am.

SUMMARY

The Griffith Sikh Community has proposed to hold the Shaheedi Tournament Griffith (Sikh Games) at Ted Scobie Oval on 8 & 9 June 2024. Due to the predicted large number of participants, traffic control will be required to manage vehicle and pedestrian traffic associated with the event.

RECOMMENDATION

- (a) Support the implementation of the attached Traffic Control Plans relevant to the 2024 Shaheedi Tournament (Sikh Games).
- (b) Note the Traffic Management Plan as submitted.

REPORT

The Gurdwara Singh Sabha Society - Griffith Sikh community has proposed to hold the annual Shaheedi Tournament (Sikh Games) at Ted Scobie Oval (Lot 1 DP 40048) between 8:00am and 6:00pm on Saturday 8 and Sunday 9 June 2024. The event will involve various sports and is expected to attract upwards of 15,000 - 20,000 people to the oval over the 2 days.

Due to the large number of spectators predicted to attend the event, traffic management is required that consists of measures to mitigate excessive amounts of parking/illegal parking in the immediate locality, increase safety for pedestrians as well as traffic control devices to warn road users of increased pedestrian traffic in the area. These measures include:

- A speed zone reduction to 40 km/h on each approach to Ted Scobie Oval;
- The use of bus services to transport spectators to and from the oval via nominated pickup points across the city;
- The implementation of a temporary bus zone for 30m along Clifton Boulevard;
- A No Parking zone along the entire Clifton Boulevard frontage of Ted Scobie Oval (with the exception of the bus zone area);
- The installation of para webbing on the western side of the shared path adjacent to Clifton Boulevard;
- The installation of water filled barriers as per the Traffic Control Plan to restrict parking near intersections;
- Reserved parking in the Ted Scobie Carpark for emergency services and essential services;
- Warning Signage advising of an increase in pedestrian activity shall be erected to complement the 40 km/h speed zone; and
- Use of Parking Compliance Officers to manage illegal parking issues.

The Traffic Control Plan (attached) has been prepared by Griffith City Council's Engineering Department detailing the traffic control measures to be installed for the event. The plan

conforms to the requirements of AS 1742.3 and the RMS' Guide to Traffic Control at Worksites.

The traffic control measures will be set up and packed down by accredited traffic controllers. Traffic controllers will be responsible for the auditing of provisions to ensure that the signs are not altered or removed during the event.

Copies of relevant Traffic Management and Traffic Control Plans will be provided to Police, Ambulance, NSW Fire and Rescue, NSW Rural Fire Service and State Emergency Service by the event organisers well in advance of the proposed date.

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1. Event

The following Traffic Management Plan has been prepared by Griffith City Council on behalf of the Gurdwara Singh Sabha Society Griffith. The traffic management plan incorporates recommendations that shall be applied to the annual Sikh Games – Shaheedi Tournament proposing to be held at Ted Scobie Oval (LOT 1 DP 40048). The event is set to take place between 8:00am and 6:00pm on Saturday 8 and Sunday 9 June 2024 and will involve various sports including soccer, athletics, tug of war and the traditional Kabaddi wrestling. It is predicted the event will attract approximately 15,000 – 20,000 people.

Setting up of the event will take place over several days leading up to the event with pack down taking place immediately after the event.

2. Traffic Data

The event is to be held at the Ted Scobie Sports Oval which is located in the centre of the Collina area. Ted Scobie Sports Oval is surrounded by Doolan Crescent and Clifton Boulevard.

Doolan Crescent is a two (2) lane, two (2) way bitumen sealed road with kerb and gutter located along both sides of the road. Doolan Crescent is classified as an "Access road" as specified on Council's Road Hierarchy Plan. Doolan Crescent has a speed limit of 50km/h. Griffith City Council conducted a traffic count along Doolan Crescent in March 2019. The average daily traffic count for that period was 1,126 vehicles per day.

Clifton Boulevard is a two lane, two way bitumen sealed road with kerb and gutter located along both sides of the road and a central splitter island. Clifton Boulevard is classified as a "collector road" as specified on *Council's Road Hierarchy Plan*. Clifton Boulevard has a speed limit of 50km/h. Griffith City Council conducted a traffic count along Clifton Boulevard in November 2021 between Hillam Drive and Doolan Crescent. The average daily traffic count for that period was 1,971 vehicles per day.

3. Traffic Management

Due to the large amount of spectators and the existing car parking at Ted Scobie Oval, the traffic management for the event will consist of; measures to mitigate excessive amount of parking in the immediate locality, increase safety for pedestrians, as well as traffic control devices to warn road users of increased traffic in the area. The following measures are described in this section below.



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3.1 Traffic Control

A Traffic control plan, as attached, has been prepared by Griffith City Council's Engineering Department, detailing the traffic control measures to be installed for the event. The plan conforms to the requirements of AS 1742.3 and the RMS' Guide to Traffic Control at Worksites

The traffic control measures will be implemented and taken down by accredited individuals who have completed the two day Traffic Control for Worksites course. Provisions to ensure that the signs are not altered or removed during the day will be established. The following traffic control will be in place;

- A speed zone reduction to 40 km/h on each approach to Ted Scobie Oval;
- The use of bus services to transport spectators to and from the oval via nominated pickup points across the city;
- The implementation of a temporary bus zone for 30m along Clifton Boulevard;
- A No Parking zone along the entire Clifton Boulevard frontage of Ted Scobie Oval (with the exception of the bus zone area);
- The installation of para webbing on the westerns side of the shared path adjacent to Clifton Boulevard;
- The installation of water filled barriers as per the Traffic Control Plan to restrict parking near intersections.
- Reserved parking in the Ted Scobie Carpark for emergency services and essential services:
- Warning Signage advising of an increase in pedestrian activity shall be erected to complement the 40 km/h speed zone; and
- Compliance Officers Traffic/Parking Marshals will be required to monitor illegal parking in and around the vicinity. Zero tolerance on illegal parking will apply.

3.2 Pedestrian & Cyclists

Pedestrians are considered a high risk user group in road safety terms, especially with the inclusion of children and the elderly, therefore to minimise risk to the participants and public – the event organisers will promote the use of existing pedestrian facilities including the adjacent shared paths, footpaths and refuges as a preferred route by all pedestrians. It is anticipated the event will have little impact on (or attract) cyclists.

A 2.5 metre shared path is located along the western side of Clifton Boulevard between Sanders Street and Doolan Crescent. A 1.5 metre footpath is located around the perimeter of Ted Scobie Oval. Pedestrians and cyclists utilising the facilities will be required to give way to the approaching traffic as per the NSW Road Rules 2014.



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3.3 Parking

It is proposed the carpark will be used for event related marques, toilets, deliveries etc resulting in the loss of 136 car parking spaces and 4 disabled spaces. However, a modified Traffic Control Plan has been developed to ensure the disabled parking remains available for use by persons holding the appropriate Mobility Parking Scheme dashboard permits. In addition, approximately 8 parking spaces will be reserved for emergency services vehicles and parking enforcement vehicles. The remainder of the carpark will be used by event related structures meaning the loss of 126 car parking spaces. As a result, parking for the event will be reliant upon unrestricted on-street parking around the venue. Due to the amount of spectators and participants, there is insufficient parking in the vicinity of the oval. During the 2023 event, parking enforcement was undertaken in the area which resulted in almost 900 illegal parking offences being detected. To mitigate parking issues, a recommendation within this Traffic Management Plan is to incorporate a bus service to be run from Ted Scobie Oval along a prescribed route through Griffith to the Sikh temple at 895 Kidman Way.




Figure 1- Bus Service Route from Sikh Temple to Ted Scobie Oval



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The proposed bus service will pick up and drop off spectators and participants of the event. The bus service will encourage the event community to park at designated areas (such as the S kh temple) along the above prescribed route. This will seek to alleviate on street parking concerns around Doolan Crescent and Clifton Boulevard. The bus service will begin at the Sikh Temple located at 895 Kidman Way. Participants and spectators will be encouraged to park their vehicles at the temple and catch the bus to Ted Scobie Oval. The bus service will travel along Kidman Way, Jondaryan Avenue, Banna Avenue, Blumer Avenue and Clifton Boulevard before returning to the temple. The may stop to pick up or drop off the event community along the prescribed route when needed. There should be a minimum of two buses in operation during the event with 30 minute intervals of leaving Ted Scobie Oval. A designated bus zone is incorporated in the Traffic Control Plan.

In addition, the bus service will be able to pick up or drop off spectators and participants of the event at major tourist attractions, shopping centres or accommodation venues when requested. This will encourage event patrons to utilise the bus service.

The Griffith Visitors Information Centre carpark has approximately 150 parking spaces. In addition, there is a significant amount of on street parking available along Banna Avenue between Jondaryan Avenue and Bonegilla Road. The existing parking facilities will be able to cater for the vehicles associated with the event.

3.4 Heavy Vehicles

The event will not affect heavy vehicle travel within Griffith. While the streets surrounding Ted Scobie Oval allow general access for heavy vehicles up to 19 metres in length, it does not form part of the B-double/Road Train heavy vehicle network.

3.5 Emergency Services

The event will not require the closure of any roads and minimal effect will occur for emergency service vehicles across the Griffith Local Government Area. Copies of relevant Traffic Management and Traffic Control Plans will be provided to Police, Ambulance, NSW Fire and Rescue, NSW Rural Fire Service and the State Emergency Service by the event organisers well in advance of the proposed date. It will be a condition of approval of the Traffic Management Plan that the event organisers provide a written advising to emergency services regarding the event, including a copy of the Traffic Control Plan one month prior to the event. Copies of those advisings will also be required to be submitted to council.

3.5.1 Police

Griffith Police Station is located at 47 Railway Street between Kooyoo Street and Tranter Place. Access to Ted Scobie Oval will be available at all times.

3.5.2 Ambulance

Griffith Ambulance Station is located at 192-196 Wakaden Street. Access to Ted Scobie Oval will be available at all times.

3.5.3 Fire Brigade

Griffith Fire Station is located at 11 Jondaryan Avenue at the corner of Jondaryan Avenue and Yambil Street. Access to Ted Scobie Oval will be available at all times.

3.6 Public Transport

Griffith Buslines currently provides a public bus service for Griffith and the surrounding area 7 days a week. The event organiser will be respons ble for notifying relevant bus companies and taxi operators of the event. Should the event impact public transport operations, the event organiser will be required to negotiate contingencies with the public transport provider. Copies of those advisings will also be required to be submitted to council.

3.7 Contingency Plan

If the event cannot occur on this date due to inclement weather or another unforseen circumstance the event shall be cancelled.

3.8 Advertising of Traffic Management

The event organiser is to advertise the context of traffic control/management in local media no less than fourteen (14) days prior to the event. This is beyond any promotional advertising for the event itself. Copies of advertising confirmation will also be required to be submitted to council.



TITLE Installation of a Bus Zone and Pedestrian Infrastructure - Citrus Road

SUMMARY

As part of a development application for a manufactured housing estate, a bus zone and pedestrian facilities are proposed to be installed on Citrus Road adjacent to the development to allow access to public transport servicing the estate. Regulatory signs and a pedestrian refuge are required to define the new zones.

RECOMMENDATION

The Traffic Committee approve the installation of prescribed traffic control devices associated with the proposed bus zone and pedestrian refuge as per the attached plan.

<u>REPORT</u>

The Lincoln Place Manufactured Homes development is currently under construction on a large lot situated on Citrus Road and Calabria Road. The estate will comprise of approximately 130 moveable dwelling sites, community buildings and internal roads.

To facilitate public transport access to the site, a bus zone has been proposed to be installed on the eastern side of Citrus Road north of the intersection of Calabria Road to service the estate. The proposed bus zone will be 34 metres in length across the Citrus Road frontage of the development. 'Bus Zone' signs will define the area in addition to No Stopping signs which are sought to be implemented on the approach side of the bus zone to allow a clear path of travel for the vehicle and to ensure safe sight distances are achieved.


To supplement the bus zone, a centre median with pedestrian facilities will also be constructed on Citrus Road to the south of the proposed bus zone. A 'Keep Left' sign will be installed on the northern end of the centre median to provide direction to drivers travelling south on Citrus Road on approach to the pedestrian facility. In furtherance, a supplementary 'Pedestrian Refuge' sign and a symbolic pedestrian sign will be installed on the northern approach in advance to the median.
